Bravo Company Performing Arts School provides theatre classes at the Crighton Theatre in downtown Conroe and is the educational wing of Stage Right, the residential theatre company of the theatre. Classes are offered for children ages 5 years through high school. Class size is limited which provides more personal instruction. Bravo Company students will have the opportunity to perform onstage in the magnificent Crighton Theatre.

Why study dramatic arts? Dramatic arts or theatre classes allow a student to explore new and various roles, try out and experiment with a variety

of personal choices and solutions to problems in a safe environment. This develops creative problem solving abilities that carry over to every day life. The center of all acting is communication. Drama allows students to communicate with and understand others more readily. This can impact a child's life in many positive ways. They may be less likely to have difficulty with public speaking and may become more persuasive in their communications, both verbal and written. Theatre classes enable a person to be better able to put themselves in others' shoes and empathize with them. After all, the dramatic arts is the study of the way human beings interact. Through that dramatic interaction, children learn collaboration and teamwork along with self-control and discipline.

Bravo Company students will learn basic theatre vocabulary, voice projection and auditioning techniques. Characterization, structured improvisation and scene studies are included as well. Game type activities are utilized to teach these skills in a creative and entertaining manner.

As part of the educational process we encourage our students and their families to see live theatre as part of their theatre formation. For instance, "An Evening with Mark Twain" will be presented at the Crighton Theatre on October 8, 2011 at 3 and 7 PM starring Kurt H. Sutton. Experience Mark Twain through his hilarious witticisms, wisdom and love for



music. Drama students get a special discount at the 3 PM performance. There is no better way to learn and appreciate good acting than to see it in action.

Bravo Company is proud to welcome its newest instructor, Katt Gilcrease. Katt is a veteran actor with television, commercial, and film credits under his belt. He has recent appearances in three movies including: *Up and Down* (Michael Spencer), *Oil* (Paul Watkins), and *Tree of Life* (featured extra).
